ONE BLOOR PRESENTATION CENTRE

Bloor Street is Toronto's most chic locale, and One Bloor, the 75-story high-rise complex located on the southeast corner of Yonge and Bloor Streets, fits in perfectly, thanks in part to Cecconi Simone's chic interior design.

The firm, hired by developer Great Gulf Homes to design all of the interior spaces, had a lot of work to do. One Bloor comprises 690 condominiums, 100,000 square feet of retail space, and a number of resort-inspired amenities, including a fitness center. It is also developer Great Gulf Homes's flagship condominium complex.

Cecconi Simone started by considering the exterior architecture, which Hariri Pontarini Architects had designed with a simple silhouette sculpted with curves in a modernist style. "The architecture is iconic in that it creates a vocabulary that other high rises in our city haven't with its form and use of materials," says Simone. "And we wanted the exterior and interior architecture to be seamless."



One of the most inspiring spaces is the presentation center, which serves as an introduction to the entire project. Visitors can obtain information about the project through Acid Integrations' gesturing technology, which allows individuals standing in front of a large interactive virtual wall to access different parts of the tower a with a hand movement. "It's as if you were living in the tower itself," says Simone.

Cecconi Simone's goal with the presentation center was to convey a sense of what one would experience in the building. "Its design is evocative of the architecture and interior itself," says Simone. "Organic, fluid and completely harmonious, it, like the rest of the building, conveys the fact that even though you're in an urban landscape, when you come home, you feel a sense of tranquility."

At 2,400 square feet, the presentation center is small for a project of One Bloor's scale, but that was intentional, says Simone. "We were trying to convey intimacy, which is what you'd feel in your home," she explains.

VILLA KISHT

The Villa Kishti project, a private vacation home on the island of Anguilla in the British West Indies, came to Cecconi Simone in an unusual manner. "The clients planned to design the interior themselves, but one of their suppliers, a kitchen manufacturer, strongly suggested they contact us," Simone says. The timing was perfect—it was critical that the homeowners

brought Cecconi Simone into the project early on. "We looked through seven sheets of architectural drawings, and no thought had been given to the interior whatsoever," says Simone. "As a result, we were a part of many aspects of the project, including architecture and landscaping as well as interior design."

The challenges that arose when building

the 15,600-square-foot home were numerous, says Simone. "To start, the architect had only developed the conceptual design for the exterior of the home. From this, we had to prepare extensive working drawings for the exterior lighting and landscaping, as well as for the interior, while still being true to the original, exterior concept. Also, we were challenged by working on an island; getting used to the local tempo and culture, getting materials in and out. Logistical planning and scheduling were crucial." Additionally, the clients needed a space that balanced common areas with private space. "Two elements that were especially important for the clients were privacy—for guests, their sons, and themselves—and places for gathering. Also, sight lines to the water had to be present at all times and from all areas of the home, including bedrooms and bathrooms. One was always to be reminded of the home's magnificent setting," Simone explains. "We designed a common living room, dining room, and kitchen. [We also designed] private villas, each with a private terrace and panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean, for the clients and each of their three sons."

The architecture of Frank Hamilton and interior design of Cecconi Simone complements the volcanic-rock shoreline that fronts the home. Simone says the result is a home that is contemporary in its sensibility, but very much embraces its environment. "It would be difficult to place the home elsewhere because it has become part of its surroundings," she explains. "It's at one with its landscape."









TORONTO PENTHOUSE

When two former clients approached Cecconi Simone with a new project, it was an interior designer's dream. "They had purchased 4,500 square feet of raw penthouse space, completely unfinished, and the only restraint we had was the location of the plumbing," Cecconi gushes. "It was a great opportunity in that it allowed us to start with an open palette."

The penthouse, located in the Yorkville neighborhood of Toronto, took up an entire floor, so it had exceptional city views from every room. To take advantage of that space, and the clients' desire for a non-traditional home, Cecconi Simone suggested an open floor plan, with most areas divided by movable walls. "The flow of the living room is exceptional," says Cecconi. "It features a central fireplace in a large family-living room with a television on one side and an intimate seating area that flows into the dining room on the other side."

The only enclosed room is the master bedroom suite, which consists of a bedroom, his-and-hers dressing rooms that feel like a high-end retail space, and his-and-hers bathrooms with exceptional appointments. "[The master suite] comprises a third of the penthouse, which is unusual, but it met the needs of the clients, who had been living in a more traditional home and wanted a contemporary space."

Though Cecconi Simone often works with Cartier Kitchens, a cabinetry company that shares the firm's modern style, the firm chose cabinets by Paris Kitchens for this home. The designers also used an Elite Tile product that's new to North America throughout much of the penthouse: Len Dilegno, a 2' x 4' veneer,

MARBLE Ciot ciot.com which gives the home's walnut floors an entirely unique look. "It's like wall paneling, but it's on a horizontal surface [on the floor], so it's very unexpected," Cecconi says. "At the same time, the freshness of the material provides sophistication to the space."

The entire project went smoothly, with even the home's challenges turning into positives, Cecconi says. "The only way to position the tub at the windows in the wife's bathroom was to build a platform to conceal the plumbing," she explains. "It was originally intended to be functional, but it ended up being a very beautiful design element." •


